

April 21 – September 23, 2020



Confirmed COVID-19 cases in Guadalupe residents by date of specimen collection — April 21– September 23, 2020 (N = 399)







How Guadalupe slashed its COVID-19 case rate

She was at home watching a movie with her son when the phone rang one day in late May. Guadalupe Mayor Valerie Molina was on the line, and asked to meet at Town Hall the following day.

COVID-19 Financial Assistance

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Maricopa County Department of Human Services and the Town of Guadalupe are providing financial assistance for rent, utility/water bills, and security deposits to lowto-moderate income residents in need for a period of up to three months.

Annual Income Requirements

To qualify for assistance, households must meet the following income requirements and demonstrate a financial hardship caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Family of 1: \$43,600/year Family of 2: \$49,800/year Family of 3: \$56,050/year Family of 4: \$62,250/year Family of 5: \$67,250/year Family of 6: \$72,250/year
