STATE OF ARIZONA EXECUTIVE ORDER

Executive Order 2021-06

New Phase of COVID-19 Mitigation Business Guidelines Transition From Requirements To Recommendations

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 26-303 and 36-787, I, as Governor of the State of Arizona, issued a declaration of a Public Health State of Emergency due to the necessity to prepare for prevent, respond to, and mitigate the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 30, 2020, the Director of the Arizona Department of Health Services (ADIIS), based on an epidemiological assessment of Arizona specific data and in alignment with the Centers for Disease Control and Preventian (CDC) guidance, recommended the State implement enhanced mitigation strategies which are continuing; and

WHERCEAS, on May 12, 2020, Executive Order 2020-36, Stay Healthy, Return Smarter, Return Stranger, was issued directing husinesses, institutions, professions and entities to develop, establish and implement policies to miligate COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on June 17, 2020, Executive Order 2020-40, Containing the Spread of COVID-19, was usued requiring businesses to enforce COVID-19 mitigation protocols and allowing local governments to adopt policies regarding the wearing of face coverings in public to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 while still keeping businesses open to the greatest extent possible; and

WHEREAS, on June 29, 2020, due to rising case numbers in the state, Executive Order 2020-43. Pausing of Arizona's Reopenlog, was issued pausing the operations of certain business determined high risk by public health entities and limitations of organized public overts were put in place to limit the spread of COVID-19 and was continued by Executive Order 2020-52 and portions regarding public events were amended by Executive Order 2020-59, Farther Miligation Requirements for Events; and

WHEREAS, on July 9, 2020, Executive Order 2020-47, Reducing the Rink, Slawing the Spread, was issued limiting capacity of restaurants to slow and limit the spread of COV/D-19 while still keeping them open, and

WHEREAS, on August 10, 2020, the Director of ADHS, under the authority delegated by A.R.S. § 26-307, chapted Transpersoy Measure 2020-02. Standing the Spread of COVID-19: Phosed Reopening, which implemented capacity requirements for high and medium tisk husinesses to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 while ensuring they were able to stay open and operate to the greatest extent possible; and

WHEREAS, since that time and into January 2021, Arizona saw increases in cases and deaths that exceeded those seen during Arizona's first wave of COVID-19; and

Governor Ducey Executive Order 2021-06 New Phase of COVID19 Mitigation

Business Guidelines Transition From Requirements To Recommendations

March 25, 2021

"....no county, city or town may make or issue any order, rule or regulation that conflicts with or is in addition to the policy...This includes but is not limited to mandated use of face coverings. Any city, town or county that has a rule, regulation or ordinance not in place as of March 11, 2020 that is in conflict with the provisions of this order shall not be enforced."

What this means:

- All mandatory requirements are off.
- People and entities encouraged to maintain distancing and wear masks but not mandated.
- All prior orders by any Town not in force by March 11, 2020 may not be enforced.
- Organized public events restrictions lifted.
- Private business owners may require masks and social distancing and may refuse service to those refusing to cooperate.
- Towns, Cities, Counties limited to enforcing its own mitigation policies in its own buildings and on public transportation.
- Order specifically refers to "in their own government buildings and on public transportation...."
- Did not mention parks or
- Open event areas similar to Mercado seeking further guidance and intent.




Guadalupe COVID19 Weekly Positive Cases


Guadalupe Total COVID19 Positive Cases


